ORDER:

In the letter second read above, the Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has stated that, the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs (DMD) has been informed that the Central Government keeping in view of the spread of Covid-19 Virus in India and the declaration of Covid-19 a pandemic by the World Health Organization (WHO), by way of a special onetime dispensation, has decided to treat it as a notified disaster for the purpose of providing assistance under State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF). The Government of Tamil Nadu vide its Notification No.118 dated 14.03.2020, (G.O.Ms.No.95, Health and Family Welfare (P1) Department, dated 13.3.2020) have declared that Corona Virus Disease (Covid-19) as a notified disease in the State of Tamil Nadu.

2. The Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has further stated that pursuance to the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in WP.(C).No.554 of 2021 and WP.(C).No.539 dated 30.06.2021 and National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) under section 12 (iii) of Disaster Management Act,

2005 certain guidelines have been issued for ex-gratia assistance of Rs.50,000/- per deceased person including those involved in relief operations or associated in preparedness activities, subject to the cause of death being certified as Covid-19 as per guidelines jointly issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and Indian Council of Medical Research on 03.09.2021. Further to comply with the above orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) under Section 12(iii) of Disaster Management Act, 2005 for exgratia assistance of Rs.50,000/- per deceased person including those involved in relief operations or associated in preparedness activities, subject to the cause of death being certified as Covid-19 and based on the Media bulletin of Directorate of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of Tamil Nadu, dated 24.11.2021 the number of Covid-19 deaths in Tamil Nadu is 36,413.

3. The Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has therefore requested to sanction a sum of Rs.182,06,50,000/- from State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) to 37 districts and Greater Chennai Corporation as per the guidelines issued and it is detailed below:-

- 4. In the Government Order third read above, the Government have issued amendment to in the Government Order first read above, under the heading "Gratuitous Relief" as added the new entry as 1(f) after 1(e) in the 'revised list of items and norms of assistance from State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) and National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF).
- 5. The Government after careful consideration, accept the proposal of the Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration and based on the approval of the State Executive Committee, accord sanction for a sum of Rs.182,06,50,000/- (Rupees One Hundred and Eighty Two Crore Six Lakhs and Fifty Thousand only) from State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) to 37 districts and Greater Chennai Corporation towards the ex-gratia assistance to the legal heirs of deceased due to Covid-19 as detailed above.
- 6. The amount of sanctioned in paragraph 5 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-
 - 2245 Relief on Account of Natural Calamities 80 General 800 other expenditure State's Expenditure AH Disaster Preparedness/ Preventive measures to contain the outbreak of Corona Virus (Covid-19) 309 Grants-in-Aid 09 Others.

7. Necessary additional funds of Rs.182,06,50,000/- will be provided in Revised Estimate/Final Modified Appropriation 2021-2022. Pending provision of such funds, the Principal Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue

Administration is authorized to incur the expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above. The expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the Legislative Assembly by Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2021-2022. He is also directed to include the above item of expenditure while sending Budget proposal of Revised Estimate/Final Modified Appropriation 2021-2022 and also send necessary draft explanatory notes for inclusion of this expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates 2021-2022 to Finance (Revenue/BG-I) Department at an appropriate time without fail.

8. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance (Revenue) Department vide its U.O.No.619/BG-II/2022, dated: 04.01.2022 and ASL No.1357(One thousand three hundred and fifty seven).
